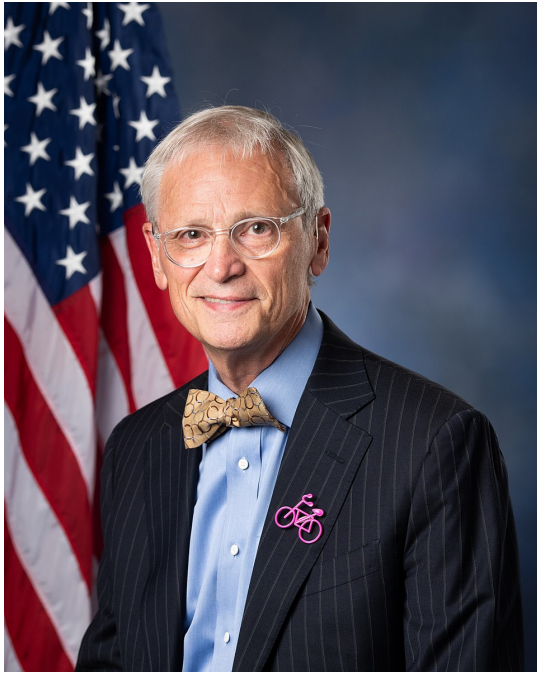
Biography: Representative Bentz was

bachelor's degree from Eastern Oregon
University and his J.D. from Lewis and

Clark College. Prior to his life in public service, Bentz worked for the Ontario, Oregon law firm Yturri, Rose and ran his own farm. He began his political career as a member of the Oregon Water Resources Commission. He was appointed to the Oregon State House in 2008 and served in that body until his appointment to the Oregon State Senate in 2018. In 2020, Bentz replaced retiring Representative Greg Walden as the representative for Oregon's 2nd congressional district.

Oregon. He got his bachelor's
degree and J.D. from Lewis and
Clark College. Blumenauer's
political career began with his
support of a failed effort to lower

Oregon's voting age (a part of the national movement to lower voting ages in response to the Vietnam War). In 1972, he was then elected to the Oregon State House, where he served until 1979 when he left to become a Multnomah County Commissioner. He was later elected to the Portland City Council in 1986, where he served until 1996. He eventually ran for Portland Mayor, but lost to Mayor Vera Katz. He then ran a successful campaign to represent Oregon's 3rd congressional district in the United States House of Representatives. He has served in that capacity ever since.

California. She earned her
bachelor's degree from
Emmanuel College in Boston.
Her family moved to Lane
County, Oregon in 1999 where

she worked in sales and marketing for bicycle manufacturers Burley Design and Cane Creek. She also served as a legislative aide for State Senator Floyd Prozanski and as director of the United Way of Lane County. She was appointed to the Oregon State House of representatives in 2009 and served as majority leader for the 2013 legislative session. She then ran an unsuccessful campaign for Oregon Secretary of State in 2015. In 2018, she ran a successful campaign for Oregon Labor Commissioner. Then she won election to represent Oregon's 4th congressional district in the United States House of Representatives, replacing long-time Representative Peter DeFazio.

Biography: Representative DeRemer was born in Santa Clara, California and got her bachelor's degree from UC Fresno. She was elected to the City Council of Happy Valley, Oregon in 2004, and was later elected Mayor in 2010. In

2016 she ran for Oregon State House District 51, but lost to Janelle Bynum by a narrow margin. She ran for the same seat again in 2018, losing to Representative Bynum for the second time. In 2022, she defeated Jamie McLeod-Skinner to become the representative of Oregon's 5th congressional district in the United States House of Representatives.

Biography: Representative Salinas was born the daughter of an immigrant from Mexico in San Mateo, California. She received her bachelor's degree from UC Berkeley. After graduating from college, Salinas served as a legislative aide to U.S.

Senator Harry Reid and U.S. Representatives Pete Stark and Darlene Hooley. She then went on to serve as the legislative director of the Oregon Environmental Council, which she later left to start her own legislative consulting practice. In 2017, she was appointed to the Oregon House of Representatives, where she served until 2022 when she left to run for Congress. In 2022, she won in a fairly close election against Mike Erickson to represent Oregon's newly crafted 6th congressional district in the United States House of Representatives.

Biography: Senator Wyden was born in Wichita, Kansas to Jewish parents who had fled Nazi Germany. He received his bachelor's degree from Stanford University and his J.D. from the University of Oregon. Prior to his political life, Wyden taught

gerontology at several Oregon universities and advocated for elder issues. In 1980, Wyden primaryed incumbent Representative Bob Duncan and won election to represent Oregon's 3rd congressional district in the United States House of Representatives. Wyden served in that capacity until he ran for ro replace United States Senator Bob Packwood in the 1996 special election. Wyden won that election by a narrow margin and has served as Oregon's United States Senator ever since.

Biography: Senator Merkley was born in Myrtle Creek, Oregon. He received his bachelor's degree from Stanford University and his Masters degree from the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University. He then worked as a Presidential Management Fellow in the Office of the Secretary of Defense. After leaving that position, he

worked at the Congressional Budget Office where he analyzed nuclear weapons policies. Then, in 1991, he returned to Portland where he served as the executive director of Portland Habitat for Humanity. In 1998, Merkley was elected to the Oregon House of Representatives, later becoming Speaker of the House in 2006. Then in 2008, Merkley ran to unseat United States Senator Gordon Smith, winning the election by a narrow margin. He has served as Oregon's Junior United States Senator ever since.
